

NEW COUNTY ANIMAL SHELTER

Kalamazoo County Animal Services was just given the 'go ahead' to build a new County Animal Shelter by the County Commissioners, with a \$5M budget. A new shelter is much needed improvement for KCASE however it is not without some concern. Katie Timber, SPCA of SWMI Executive Director, has been recently appointed on the Animal Services Advisory Board for the Shelter Project where she has had the opportunity to share her animal welfare expertise and recommendations. She has expressed concerns that the preliminary building designs and business proposals lack space and resources for animals to receive medical services, which she says is expected in any new shelter like this. She recently publicly addressed her concerns that this project, no matter how much they spend, does not address the issues of animal welfare and reduction of intake and euthanasia at a Kalamazoo County Commissioners meeting (watch her here). "We [at the SPCA of SWMI] are working on building a more humane community and will work to share your voice," says Katie Timber. In a recent mLIVE article, Commissioner Scott McGraw also expressed concerns and Commissioner Julie Rogers asked for community engagement during the design process. We recommend that all the animal lovers in Kalamazoo County and beyond stay tuned into this project progress and contact your Commissioner with questions and/or concerns. Katie hopes that with your feedback, together a more humane community can be forged starting at addressing animal welfare at the County level. WELCOME OUR NEW OFFICE STAFF SARA AND CALEB


Sara Singleton -








BENTLEY
